1. Student Satisfaction Survey

IQAC cell of Govindrao Nikam college of pharmacy, Sawarde conducts Student Satisfaction Survey (SSS) to monitor and analysis the student's perception about Teaching – Learning and performance of college, infrastructural development. This survey helps to upgrade the quality of process.

This survey includes the questionnaire recommended by NAAC. In SSS there would be twenty-one questions all over and out of which, twenty questions would be objective type and one question provides opportunity for the students to give their observations / suggestions in a descriptive way to improve the overall teaching – learning experience in our institution.

The Questionnaire is based on the Likert scale on a graded marking system. Highest positive response is rated as 4 and the lowest negative response is rated as 0. This removes the binary forced approach and provides a more comfortable wider range for students to register their opinion.

The questionnaire is circulated through google form. A student will have to respond to all the questions given in the following format with her/his sincere effort and thought. The outcome of the survey will help to reach the objective of the institution. This will also help to initiate remedial action to improve the facilities whenever and wherever it is required. The result of the survey will provide a base to plan for the future.

Total 274 students responded to Student Satisfaction Survey. The analysis of the survey conducted shows that, more than 75% students were highly satisfied on the teaching learning process of the institution.




